About World Wildlife Day:

World Wildlife Day will be celebrated on March 3 2021 under the theme **Forests and Livelihoods: Sustaining People and Planet**, highlighting the role of forest ecosystems in covering basic needs such as food, shelter, energy and medicine, as well as sustaining livelihoods for hundreds of millions of people globally. This aligns with UN Sustainable Development Goals 1, 12, 13 and 15, and their wide-ranging commitments on alleviating poverty, ensuring sustainable use of resources, and conserving life on land. Wildlife Trafficking Awareness Statistics

- More than 7,000 species are affected by illegal wildlife trade (source: <u>UNODC</u>)
- More than 5.5 million animals and animal products have been seized in air transport in the last ten years (Source: ROUTES Dashboard)
- In the last ten years, there have been **2,079 wildlife seizures** reported in air transport, about four seizures a week (Source: ROUTES Dashboard)
- Approximately 55 elephants are poached every day (source: www.) (elephant declines due to poaching cost African economies \$25 million per year in lost tourism revenue) (source: www.)
- More than **166,000 live reptiles** and reptile parts have been seized in air transport in the last ten years (Source: ROUTES Dashboard)
- **594 rhinos** were poached in South Africa in 2019 (more than 11 rhinos a week) (Source: South Africa DEA)
- In 2019, pangolin seizures reached an all-time high, amounting to more than 116 tonnes of pangolin scales and meat (Source: C4ADS)
- Approximately 110 tigers a year enter the illegal trade chain in Asia (Source: TRAFFIC)
- More than 23,000 live birds and eggs have been seized in air transport in the last ten years (Source: ROUTES Dashboard)
